



Bylaw No. 469.5, 2025

A bylaw to amend the North Coast Regional District
Sandspit Water Service Establishment Bylaw No 469, 2005

WHEREAS the Board of the North Coast Regional District wishes to increase the maximum amount that may be requisitioned to support the water service in the portion of Electoral Area E – Sandspit under Bylaw 469, 2005, as amended;

AND WHEREAS the Director of Electoral Area E has consented, in writing, to the adoption of this Bylaw;

AND WHEREAS pursuant to B.C. Reg. 113/2007, *Regional Districts Establishing Bylaw Approval Exemption Regulation*, the Inspector of Municipality approval under section 349 (3) is not required for an amendment to an establishing bylaw that increases the maximum amount that may be requisitioned under the bylaw by an amount less than or equal to 25% of the baseline value;

NOW THEREFORE the Board of the North Coast Regional District, in open meeting assembled, enacts as follows:

1. Citation

This bylaw may be cited for all purposes as the “North Coast Regional District Sandspit Water Service Amendment Bylaw *No. 469.5, 2025*.”

2. Amendment

The North Coast Regional District Sandspit Water Service Establishment Bylaw No. 469, 2005, as amended is hereby amended by replacing section 5 in its entirety with the following:

2.1 The Board hereby increases the maximum annual requisition for this service to \$78,125.

2.2 That section 6 of Bylaw No. 469 as amended be replaced with the following:

“The maximum amount of money that may be requisitioned annually in support of this service shall not exceed seventy-eight thousand one-hundred and twenty-five dollars (\$78,125).”


