Delegations:

Steve Kozuki with the Forestry Works for BC, a grassroots nonprofit organization, presented to the Board on the positive impacts of the forestry sector in the Province. Highlighted benefits to the Province included for the energy sector, domestic timber production, workforce opportunities, healthy ecosystems, and fire mitigation.

Board Business:

1. The Board resolved to send a letter to the Minister of Transportation and Transit regarding the reduction of speed limits in high pedestrian traffic areas of Electoral Areas D and E on Haida Gwaii.
2. The Board resolved to send a letter of support to Buckets and Borders for the Masset Basketball Facility upgrade project.
3. The Board resolved to have staff prepare draft resolutions for submission to the Association of Vancouver Island and Coastal Communities 2026 Convention for the following topics:
 - a. Alaska ferry terminal reinstatement in Prince Rupert;
 - b. Small craft harbour management and jurisdiction; and
 - c. Opposition of the Union of BC Municipalities no duplicate resolution policy.
4. The Board appointed Caiden Edwards as the Chief Election Officer and Daniel Fish as Deputy Chief Election Officer for the 2026 General Local Government Elections.
5. The Board resolved to have staff reach out to PacifiCan regarding the rising port activity and the potential opportunity to utilize PacifiCan funding to address the Mile 28 Level Rail Crossing.
